“Computation And Its Role in Physics”

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Abstract:

More and more computation is being funded as faster computers make complex problems computable. Computers are allowing researchers to "observe" new phenomena never seen before in theory or experiment. Should Computational Physics be a third branch of Physics, beside Theory and Experiment? If not, what is the role of computation in Physics?
